

#### **RACES**

#### Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service

- Sanctioned under federal law
- Only operational during federally- declared disasters.

#### Amateur Radio Emergency Service

- Sanctioned by the American Radio Relay League
- Operational for training, public events and during emergencies
